Keep it up Emilia!



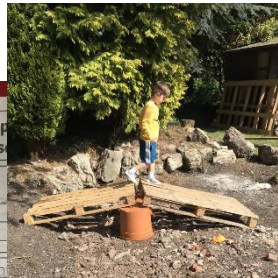
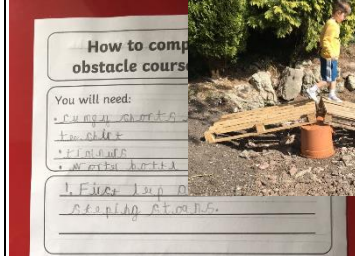
Evie (Y3) has been exploring coloured water and the different density of each colour. Magic!
